## NCSLA 2014 Annual Conference Presents "The ABCs and Marijuana: Just Getting Started with More to Come?"

2014 is a special year for NCSLA as they celebrate the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the National Conference of State Liquor Administrators in San Antonio at the annual conference, June 16-20, 2014. The annual conference theme is "NCSLA – 80 Years: Just Getting Started." Over the course of four days the business agenda will cover a number of complex and diverse issues that have evolved over the decades.

How will training be implemented? What considerations must be given to the relative potencies of various marijuana products and types? How do we deal with previous offenders who were incarcerated for marijuana law violations and, of course, what do we do to prevent "drugged driving"?
